I Emily Tullbert of the County of Fayette and State of North Carolina, being perfectly sound in mind but infirm in body, and having past the Meridian, call my Help going down the declivity of life, do make and confess this my last will and Testament in Word following As with these, I calling Conscience the Great City to its Master earth from whence it came, am sure and certain hope that it will be received at the last day - I willingly resign my soul into the hands of God who gave it, in full Confian that he cause the right truth to stand as to to bless me with what little of this world's goods it has pleased God to <sup>bestow upon me</sup> give first of all, that of my worldly effects my funeral expenses be defrayed, and all my just debts legally discharged and to what may remaine (if any thing) I do desire by this my last will and testament that it be disposed of in the following Manner by my legal Executor (hereafter named) I want Eludra my sister to have a home at the old Home stead as long as she remains single, I will and bequeath to my sister Nancy H Tullbert all of my estate which is the remaining part of the old Home stead that was not called to first L Tullbert my brother and every thing I have as long as she lives and after all of our debts to be paid and the debts to be paid (if any) and Equally divided Between Esther Tullbert children, Children, and Mary A Massey children My two sisters children. After I am gone if Nancy gets in a suffering condition, I give her the authority to sell some of the land and give a good right to it.
