I Edward Penbow being of sound
mind & memory but considering the uncertainty
of this first will I make and declare this to be
my last will & Testament First recommending my
dear to God from whence it came, My will is that a
suitable outfit for any burial such as my family
may wish & that all my just Debts be paid for by
Executor, out of the first money that may come into
my hands.

I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth W Penbow
my home or house place or lot or tract of land so joining
the same which is bounded by a line leading from
my barn it being a part of different lots or lots of land
which joins each other at fair East as to the most known
as the farm on Queen's lot & with the line on the West
End of the same & still North from the North west corner
of the said to C.S. Penbow, then during her widow life
time & at her death to be equally divided in valuation between
my nine children to wit C.S. Penbow one ninth part
H.B. Penbow one ninth part E.A.C. Penerson one quarter
L.S. Penbow one quarter part S.A.G. Tomlinson one quarter part
O.L. Whittington one quarter part M.C. Jones one quarter part
John J. Penbow one quarter part & F.W. Penbow one quarter part & to be
divided by them only that they may agree upon & valued by themselves
& to be so divided that each may have a lot fronting the road & the
land from East Bend to McRae's on as many of them as
may wish such lot & the most valuable lots to pay to those
of less value so as to make them all equal in valuation
I also give & bequeath to my wife Elizabeth W Penbow for
one year suppose one hundred dollars in money one
horse her choice 2 cows her choice my one horse & wagon
& gear up one buggy & harness all farming tools she may
use together with all my house hold & Kitchen furniture
that she may wish, a few in description to use on despatch as
she may desire but if there should be any not disposed of at her
death my executors shall sell the same & equally divide between
my nine children I also give to my wife Elizabeth W Penbow
all the income or profits that may arise from my lands
in the store that belongs to myself for 20 years after she dies it shall be
the interest of one thousand dollars to be put at mind
by my executors and received by real estate mortgage or

I give & bequeath to O.S. Benbow S.A. Tomlinson
of Whetstone the lands known as the lawns on
Kearns Avenue & a part of the John Brown
lands at Elyria divided equally in valuation
& to be divided & valued together in what may
agree between us to be divided. In the sum & substance
of most value to pay to these of less value to make
them equal & O.S. Benbow to have the way or lot
as joining him the other 2 lots drawn for by S.A. T.
Tomlinson & O.W. Whetstone & my other 2 children
shall have money to make each of them
equally divided as follows O.S. Benbow one part
W.C. one 7th part O.H. Henderson one 9th part
L.S. Benbow one 9th part S.A. Tomlinson one 9th part
O.W. Whetstone one 9th part W.C. Jones one 9th part
J.L. Benbow one 9th part & F.B. Benbow one 9th part
At the death of my wife O.W. Benbow my interest
in the store belonging to my self & W.M. Dolab & the
process thereof together with the one thousand dollars
that is to be paid at interest for the benefit of my wife
shall be equally divided between my children as
follows O.S. Benbow one 9th part J.L. Benbow one 9th part
O.H. Henderson one 9th part L.S. Benbow one 9th part
S.A. Tomlinson one 9th part O.W. Whetstone
one 9th part W.C. Jones one 9th part J.L. Benbow
one 9th part & O.S. Benbow one 9th part

& W.C. Jones to execute this my last will &
testament
