3d I will and desire that my executor pay to my children  
hereinafter named the sum of one dollar each within two  
years after my death out of the money not otherwise  
disposed of, H.C. Brown, M.G. Stein, W.L. Brown, W.C. Hallerman,  
G.H. Brown, S.J. Brown, R.O. Brown, C.E. Lewis, P.A. Henrich  
and G.H. Brown and G.H. Brown.

4th I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife  
G.H. Brown my lawful executor to all intents and purposes  
to execute this my last will and testament according  
to the true intents and purposes, meaning of the same  
and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and  
declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments  
heretofore made. In witness whereof I the said  
G.H. Brown do herunto set my hand and seal, this  
the first day of November 1906.
