We James Gough and Emily Harriet Gough of the aforesaid County and State, being of sound mind, but considering the uncertainty of our earthly existence, do make and declare this our last will and testament.

- First. Our executors hereinafter named, shall give our bodies a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of our friends and relatives, and pay all funeral expenses, together with all our just debts, out of the first money coming into their hands belonging to our estate, also place tombstones at our graves, and pay for same out of any money in their hands belonging to our estate.
- Second. We give and devise to our daughter Eliza Mayella Gough a part of the tract of land on which we now reside. Beginning at a white oak Renegar's Corner, near old Still house, running S.E. about 200 yds. to a stone on side of Baltimore road, Renegar's Corner, thence E. about 150 yds to a stone J. K. Gough's Corner, thence with said Gough's line about 200 yds. to a white oak said Gough's Corner, then with Renegar's line about 250 yds to a stone, Renegar's Corner, then W. about 350 yds. with Renegar's line to the place of beginning containing about 15 acres be the same more or less.
- Third. We give and devise to J. Emory Gough about two acres of land on west side of Warden branch, being all the land we own on said side of said branch.
- Fourth. Our executors to sell all personal property belonging to our estate, and as much of the remainder of the lands belonging to our estate as may be ^{required} ~~needed~~ to pay all expenses as above set out. But should there be any of this land not sold for funds to pay expenses as above set out. It is our will and desire that the same be divided equally between Eliza M. Gough, and J. Emory Gough.
