

H. N. Doubt's Will

In the name of God Amen.

I, H. N. Doubt of the County of Yadkin and state of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory do hereby make, publish, and declare this my last will and testament in manner following, that is to say:

First

I order and direct my executors hereinafter named as soon after my decease as practicable, to take possession of my estate both real and personal, and convert enough of my personal estate into money with as little delay as possible, to pay off and discharge all the debts, dues, and liabilities, that may be existing against me at the time of my decease. Also to pay off any requests that I may hereinafter make. And also to appropriate a sufficient amount of money to the purchase and erection of a suitable monument to mark the place of my burial; the selection and price to be left to the choice of my executors. Should the money arising from the sale of my personal property be insufficient to satisfy all my debts, dues, liabilities and requests that I may make, then I direct my executors to sell enough of my real estate to payoff same.

Second

I will and bequeath to Nancy E. Smitherman so long as she remains unmarried, a portion of the David Smitherman tract of land and all rights, privileges and profits of same, to wit, that portion of said Smitherman lands lying on the East side of Logan Creek and known as the David Smitherman homeplace.

Also I will in the above manner to the said Nancy E. Smitherman, the John T. Smitherman house and lot, adjoining the above described tract.

In case of her marriage, or death, I will and direct that the above described tracts, pieces or parcels of land be equally divided, share and share alike, between my brothers and sister, their heirs and assigns forever. I further will and direct my executors to place Five hundred dollars (\$500⁰⁰) in cash, in trust and the interest of same to be collected semi-annually and paid to Nancy E. Smitherman, when ascertained by my executors to be necessary. At the marriage, or death of Nancy E. Smitherman, I will and direct that the Five hundred dollars (\$500⁰⁰) in cash, in trust, be

equally divided, share and share alike, between my brothers and sister, to wit, John W. Doubt, W. L. Doubt, A. J. Doubt, S. L. Doubt, A. C. Doubt, L. E. Doubt and Julia W. Spears.

I will and direct my executors to pay off J. H. Head's acct. at Auburn and Doubt store, and cancel his acct. at my mill, with his fodder, oats etc for which I am due him. I also will and direct my executors to pay the said J. H. Head Fifty dollars (\$50⁰⁰) in cash extra for his faithful duty on the farm and for his services in feeding and taking care of my stock.

I will and bequeath to my dear father and mother the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100⁰⁰) to be equally divided between them share and share alike.

Fifth

I will give and bequeath, the sum of Seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750⁰⁰) in cash or its equivalent in personal, or real estate, to be equally divided, share and share alike, between my three brothers, A. J. Doubt, A. C. Doubt and L. E. Doubt. This is to reward them for their faithful work at home, and on the farm, and for taking care of our father and mother during their old age.

Sixth

I will, give and bequeath the rest, residue and remainder of my real estate wheresoever situated, and the final remainder of personal estate, of whatever name and nature it may consist, to wit, merchandise, mill property, farming machinery, farming utensils, and all other things unmentioned, to be equally divided, share and share alike, between all my brothers and sister to wit, John W. Doubt, W. L. Doubt, A. J. Doubt, S. L. Doubt, A. C. Doubt, L. E. Doubt and Julia W. Spears, and their heirs and assigns forever.

I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint John W. Doubt and S. L. Doubt Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made.
