H. Huff or her bodily heirs a certain piece or lot of land adjoining J. H. Norman & others

1st No. 1 in the Division of my lands containing 4 acres. Secondly I give & bequeath to my son H. H. Horn or his heirs a certain piece or lot of land adjoining the lands of R. G. Patterson & others to known as lot No. 2 in Division containing 48 acres. Thirdly I give & bequeath to my daughter Willie A. Smithman or her bodily heirs (wife of J. A.
