Third I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Lucine B. Hutchins all my personal property of every kind and all description for her recreation to use and dispose of as she may desire during her natural life, but at the termination of her natural life it is my will and wish that all the remainder of the said personal property be at once divided equally among my children, share and share alike.

Fourth I hereby constitute and appoint my son Isaac E. Hutchins my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof - hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other Wills and testaments by me heretofore made.
