1st I will and bequeath to my beloved son Early A Fleming all of my Real estate, ^{and after the death} of my home place, after my death of my wife Mary C Fleming,

- " " " Daughter Rosa E. Stinson 300 --

3rd I will that my son Early A Fleming is to pay this money, to my heirs after the death of J. J. Fleming and my wife Mary C Fleming, I'm said Early A Fleming is to pay this money, to my heirs in twelve months after my death and the death of my wife Mary C Fleming

4th I will that J. J. Fleming and Mary C Fleming is to have our support off the land, and \$25 -- a year to pay the taxes on the land

5th I will that my executor, sell or equally divide between my heirs all personal property and all money or notes, or mortgages that I may have on hand at my death and at the death of Mary C Fleming after paying all Doctor bills and burial expenses all just debts

6th I will that all of my personal property be equally divided between J. R. Fleming S. C. Fleming L. H. Potts, C. R. Fleming Rosa E. Stinson and Early A Fleming

7th I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved sons Early A Fleming and S. C. Fleming as my executor to this my last will and testament,

Last, I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint C. W. Johnson, & B. C. Worth the Executors of this my last Will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made,
