I will that my wife P. A. Jones shall sell and convey at any time that she may think best.

My entire interest in my or ill property in Booneville both real and personal, sale to be made either public or private as she may think best the remainder of my real estate to remain unsold until after the death of my wife P. A. Jones then to be sold and proceeds divided among all my children.

I will that in case any of my children are dead and leave issue that issue to take the share of the parent. The intention and purpose of this will is to let my wife P. A. Jones have and control my entire estate both real and personal during the term of her natural life and not anything to be interpreted with or by her consent while she may live. I constitute and appoint my wife P. A. Jones my Executor to execute this my last will and Testament Signed sealed in the presence of witnesses.
