I, Jacob Brown of the County and State aforesaid being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last will and testament, in presence and form following.

I give to my daughters, Lena Smith, Jane Brindle and Mary Spencer to be divided equally among them, my household property consisting of beds, bedsteads etc, excepting one chest. I further give devise and bequeath unto my son J. C. Brown all the remainder of my personal property consisting of all my stock, grain, cash, notes, bonds etc of what nature or kind soever and wheresoever the same shall be at the time of my death.

And I do nominate, constitute and appoint my son J. C. Brown sole executor of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking ~~and~~ making void all and every other will or wills heretofore made by me and do declare this to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof I, said Jacob Brown have hereunto set my hand and seal this 30th day of Dec. 1896
