I, James Shore of the county of Yadkin and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but desiring the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament in witness whereof and from following that is to say, first, that my Executor hereinafter named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends, and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts however and to whomsoever owing out of the moneys that may first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate. Item - I give and devise to my beloved wife twenty five acres of land, the tract whereon I now live so as to include my mansion house all out houses and other improvements to them and to hold to her the said Susannah Shore for and during the term of her natural life in satisfaction for and in lieu of her dower and thirds of land in all my real estate. Item - I give and bequeath to my said beloved wife Susannah Shore, all the house hold and kitchen furniture and all the stock and all the crop of every description that may be on the plantation whereon I now live and all the provisions on hand at the time of my death. Item - my will and desire is that all my real and personal property shall belong to

my said wife Susannah Shore provided that she live longer than I do. Item - I give and bequeath to my son James A. Lusk one dollar as his share of my real and personal estate. Item - my eldest son (E. A. Shore) being dead I give and bequeath to his children the one third part of all my real and personal property not otherwise disposed of in this my last will and testament. Item - I give and bequeath to my son James Shore the one third part of all of my real and personal property, to give and bequeath to my youngest Elizabeth Shore the one third part of all my real and personal estate lastly my will and desire is that all my just debts be paid and all debts owing to me be collected and all my real and personal estate including every thing owned by me at my death be sold and the money be equally divided among them, what is to be James the one third part Elizabeth the one third part and David's children the remainder after the dollar of J. A. Lusk be taken out provided further that if either one of said children should have more trouble or expense in carrying for him or myself that each child shall be liberally compensated hereunto I do set my hand and seal day and date above written.
