- 3) I give and bequeath to my wife Sarah M. Denny eighteen acres of land adjoining on the east on the east the Thompson land on the north the Lee land on the west and on the south the part not yet divided.
- 4) I give and bequeath to my daughter Cora my dollar \$1.00 in money of what amount is contained at ten dollars \$10.00 per acre.
- 5) I give and bequeath to my daughter Cora one dollar with a face on the place to be used.
- 6) I give and bequeath to my eldest son Charlie Denny a fifty dollar debt he contracted to me when he was 17 years old, also the interest on same to be paid annually from that time to my death.
- 7) I give and bequeath my eldest son Charlie one dollar (\$1.00) in cash.
- 8) I give and bequeath my son William Lloyd and Floyd all of my blacksmith and mechanical tools and I want them all to use them whenever they shall need them also all farming tools and fixtures on the place.
- 9) I appoint my executors William Lloyd and Lloyd as executors of this will and desire that they shall not be required to give any security for the performance of their duties and above all things I desire that no lawyer have anything to do with my estate whether and further in any one instance in the will mentioned.
