His will was made in 1782, and probated in 1790. (Orange County 1751, from it Guilford 1770, from that Caswell in 1777, from that Rockingham in 1785)

Mary Cantrell, the widow of Jacob Cantrell, was taxed in Orange County, 1790 for 442 acres of land and 2 slaves. She moved with her family to Green County, Kentucky, where she died.

He served in the Revolutionary War from Georgia. In 1790, he purchased 500 acres of land on north side of Enoree River, 96 Dist Spartanburg County, and in 1803 he was an admn. on the estate of his father in Spartanburg District, S.C. He served in the Revolutionary War, and after the War settled in Spartanburg District, S. C., where he made his will on March 30 1823 - probated October 17 1825. He died in 1825, his sons William, Martin, & Berry Cantrell were executors of the will. John Cantrell owned a mill on Buck Creek and was called "Miller John" to distinguish him from the other John Cantrells in the community. He was an active member of the Buck Creek Baptist Church.

682. John (6) Cantrell was born July 10 1790, in Spartanburg District, S. C., he was the only son of Stephen (5) Cantrell and Unity Harris, his wife.

He married Martha Porter about 1811, she was born April 5 1794. They lived for awhile in Pickens District, S.C., but in 1821 they moved to what was then Habersham County, now White County, Georgia. They were active members of the Baptist Church and they were buried at the Shoal Creek Baptist Church Cemetery in White County. He died Sept. 22 1847, and she died on March 31 1889.

23. Thomas (4) Cantrell born January 23 1761 - died September 25 1830.

He married, about 1780, Elizabeth Norris, daughter of Thomas Norris (who served in the Revolutionary War from Pennsylvania) Elizabeth Norris was born March 10 1765. After their marriage they settled in Greenville District, South Carolina, but they later moved to Tennessee - they were said to have been the first of the name to go to Tennessee. He settled on Sink Creek, now in DeKalb County, where he operated an Iron Forge, still called the "Old Forge" His descendants still live there.

War records show that he served in Lt-Col Lytle's Command, Caswell County, N. C., "Enrolled for Captain Robert Moore" from Caswell County, North Carolina.

He was a Deacon in the Baptist Church, and he and his wife were buried in the Old Cemetery at Grady, Tennessee, which was first known as "Cantrell's Cross Roads" then as "Williamsburg" and finally as "Grady" He died on September 25 1830.

He was born in Georgia State Archives Folder Collection, N.C., and went to Spartanburg District, S.C. where he married Elizabeth

He owned a plantation on Buck Creek, and the family were members of Buck Creek Baptist Church. Around the Church is a graveyard which has been used since 1775, and is still in use. There are no plots, burials were made in rows named for the families using them, in the Cantrell Row are many old tombstones. In this row were placed James Cantrell, Elizabeth his wife, and others of their family.

James Cantrell served in the War of 1812.

It has been impossible to get a list of their children, but there was a son: Thomas

He married in Spartanburg District, S.C., about 1788, she was the daughter of Col. William Wilkins and his wife Elizabeth Wilkins. Elizabeth Wilkins was born on August 11 1771.

William Cantrell purchased land November 30 1797, on Goucher Creek, and he later purchased land on North Pacolet River adjoining William Wilkins. He accumulated considerable property in the Fork of the Pacolet River adjoining Buck Creek. He was called "Billy Cantrell, Gentleman"

Sometime after 1840 all his children moved to Georgia and Alabama

Joseph (2) Cantrill, of Philadelphia, was the son of Richard (1) Cantrill (who was in Philadelphia in 1682). Joseph (2) Cantrill was born about 1695, Philadelphia, and spent his early years in the Georgia State Archives Folder Collection

He married Catharina. They were living in New Castle, Pennsylvania, in 1720, near the site of the present city of Wilmington, Delaware, and they were attendants at the Holy Trinity (Old Swedes) Church before 1720. It is possible that Catharina was the daughter of one of the old Swedes, the first settlers of this section. Their first children were baptized at the Old Swedes Church - one of the oldest and most historic in this country. It was called Christina Parish when Joseph & Catharina Cantrill lived there. His descendants lived there from 1720 - 1797, though the majority of the descendants moved South during this period.

John (3) Cantrell (1724 - 1803) (Spelled Cantrell)

He was married twice, his first wife was Brittan, by whom he had 17 sons, and his second wife was named Jane by whom he had 4 sons and 2 daughters. It was said that there were a number of twins in his family.

John (3) Cantrell died in 1803, and his sons Abraham (4), Stephen (4), and Moses (4), administered on his estate, Spartanburg District, S. C.

There are many traditions in the family about John Cantrell and his family and their moving to the Carolinas, but the exact date of his leaving New Castle is not known. He was living in what is now Rockingham County, N.C., before the Revolution, and shortly after that war he moved to Ninety Six District, S. C., where he owned over 800 acres on Buck Creek, waters of Pacolet River. The family were devoted members of Buck Creek Baptist Church and some of the descendants still attend that church. - Aaron, Simon, & Peter Cantrell were captured and condemned to be shot. Tradition says that Peter was shot, and Aaron & Peter escaped.

The name Cantrell can be traced to the family of Chantrell, or Cantrelle, in France. The first mention of the name outside France is William Chantrell, who retained the French spelling of the name in England, and in the time of King John. From the 12 th to the 15th centuries the name appears in English records from time to time, and after that time it appears many times in England and Ireland, spelled Chantrell, Cantrill, or Cantrell.

The name first appears in America in 1608, at Jamestown, Virginia, and since that time there have been eight - possibly more - distinct families of Cantrill-Cantrell who have come to this country from England, Ireland, and France.

William Cantrill, Gentleman, arrived at Jamestown, Virginia, April 20 1608, by the ship "Phoenix". He was one of the fourteen who accompanied Captain John Smith on his "discovery of Chesapeake Bay" on June 2 1608. "Cantrill's Point" was betwixt to Patowomuk & Pamoke Rivers now the Potomac and Rappahannock Rivers, and was named for the discoverer. Henry Cantrell was a justice of the Peace at Charles City, Virginia, in 1639.

- 1. Richard Cantrill was a resident of Philadelphia prior to 1689. He evidently died prior to May 31 1753, when a caveat against "surveying the land adjoining Richard Cantrill's Estate" issuing to the heirs or executors of the said Richard Cantrill" (Pennsylvania Archives)

About 1693, Richard Cantrill married Dorothy Jones, daughter of Ellis & Jane Jones, who came to America in the ship "Submission" in September 1682. Ellis Jones was a resident of Bucks County, Pennsylvania, in 1684, and he purchased 100 acres at Radnor (Welsh Tract Purchases) @ 1684. His family were Quakers, and Dorothy Jones married Richard Cantrill "out of meeting". The will of Jane Jones, relict of Ellis Jones, August 3 1730 - December 27 1732, at Philadelphia, mentions grandchildren Zebulon, Joseph, and Dorothy Cantrill, and gives each one a shilling.
