## WARE LINEAGE

The information below was taken mainly from Wilder's *Wilders and Connections (especially Ware) Families in the Southeastern States*.

He was the son of CHRISTOPHER WARE from Yorkshire County, England. He was auditor general of Ireland and often resided in Dublin.

Settled in Hampton Parish of York County, Virginia Colony about 1630 with two sons, ROBERT and PETER

- III. PETER WARE (c1602-c1650) m 1. MARY HICKS  
2. Unknown  
Born in Dublin, Ireland and died in York County, Va. (York, then Kent, then King & Queen, now Gloucester). Here the Ware Episcopal Church was established in 1660 in Ware Parish on Ware River.

Born Rappahannock County, Va. The Edgefield County, S.C., Wares descended from this line as did U.S. Senator from Ga., NICHOLAS, for whom Ware County, Ga., was named. Their great-great-granddaughter, ELIZABETH married JAMES LONG and were the parents of Dr. CRAWFORD W. LONG (1815-1878), the first to use ether in surgery. NICHOLAS' great-great grandson, ROBERT, and his second wife, SUSAN DOWSING, had a daughter, NANCY JANE, who married ROBERT LEE COLVIN, BETH COLVIN HUFF's great-great grandmother.

- IV. PETER WARE Jr., (c1635-c1675) m JANE VALENTINE  
PETER was the constable of the upper precinct of Hampton Parish in Virginia. In October 1668, he received 200 pounds of tobacco for one wolf's head and in 1670, 400 pounds for two. March 1668: "William Cole, servant to Peter Ware, is adjudged 15 and is to serve until 24."

E. EDWARD m ELIZABETH GARRETT

He participated in the French and Indian Wars. The Abbeville, S.C., line descended from them. ELIZABETH was the daughter of JOHN GARRETT I and ELIZABETH WARE (see I, 3 of "Garrett Lineage"). Grandson NICHOLAS (m PEGGIE HODGES) settled on the Saluda River in 1792 establishing Ware Shoals, S.C.; NICHOLAS' niece, LUCY WARE, m ISAAC WEBB, and had a granddaughter, LUCY WARE WEBB, who married President RUTHERFORD B. HAYES.

VI. VALENTINE WARE Jr., m MARY DUDLEY  
Granted 600 acres (May 2, 1705) in King & Queen County, Va. He was a vestryman in Stratton Major Church

VII. HENRY WARE (1728-1801) m MARTHA GARRETT (1735-1817)

Born in Gloucester County, Va., and died in Lincoln County, Ga. MARTHA's father was JOHN GARRETT who emigrated to Edgefield County, S.C. (the old 96th District). Her sister, DOLLY (c-b.1729), married the NICHOLAS WARE who settled in Edgefield County, S.C., and was the son of NICHOLAS III and MARY THOMPSON. These Garretts were the daughters of JOHN GARRETT III (d.1784) and the the granddaughters of JOHN GARRETT (1675-1739) and FRANCES BUCKNER (see Garrett Lineage, II). HENRY raised and equipped a company of Geor-

gia Militia and served during the Revolutionary War as did his sons. He was Justice of the Peace of Wilkes County (before Lincoln was cut out of it) and represented Wilkes County as a delegate to the First Constitutional Convention of the State of Georgia. In 1784, he was granted 250 acres in Washington County, attested by Col. ELISHA CLARK, for his war service.

He was a Revolutionary War soldier, and received 250 acres in Washington County in 1784 for his service. HENRY's son JOHN MIMS married LUCY STURDIVANT and settled in Heard County, Ga. around 1827 and was the founder of the Bethel Baptist Church there; he was the great grand father of J. CRAWFORD WARE, the late Georgia State Representative. CRAWFORD's nephew, HOLLAND WARE, donated money to Emory (the Holland Ware Cancer Clinic) and Auburn University.

He is buried in Montgomery, Ala., 3 miles out on Ware's Ferry Road He was a soldier and in the Battle of Cowpens and siege of Augusta.

He served in the Revolutionary War. Drew bounty land in Wilkes and Washington County, Ga. Died in Morgan County. In 1784, he was awarded 250 acres in Washington County for war service.

 Moved from Morgan County, Ga. to Troup County, Ga. and was among the original settlers of that area. He was planter. His wife was the daughter of JOSEPH LANE and ELIZABETH HILL; she was born in Clarke County, Ga. Both are buried in the Hillview Section of the La Grange City Cemetery. In 1814, he served in Capt. Jett Thomas Company of Georgia Militia in the War of 1812.

Both born in England, JOHN in Leicestershire. ELIZABETH was the daughter of PETER WARE (c1614-1650); see "Ware Lineage III." JOHN came to Virginia in 1663 and received royal land grant with NICHOLAS WARE Jr., of 385 acres.

(1807-1875)  
Both born Laurens County, S.C.. About 1831, settled in  
Campbell County, Ga., (now Fulton). Was a farmer. Bur-  
ied in the Piney Woods Cemetery, Riverton District, Ful-  
ton County.

They had six children. He was with the 35th Ga.

Confederate Cemetery.

Buried Mt. Vernan, Marshall, Tenn.

He was a private in Co. B, 32rd Ga., Infantry from  
Talbot County and received a leg wound

EMBRY  
He joined Co. D, 15th Ga. Infantry from Warren  
County and was captured at Missionary Ridge, Nov  
25, '63; he swore allegiance to the U. S. and enlisted  
in the 3rd Regt. of U.S. Infantry at Rock Island, Ill.
- H. SARAH PRISCILLA (1843) died young
- I. ELIZABETH FANNY (b.1845) m W.W. WAL-  
THALL,  
June 22, 1865 W.W. and his brother-in-law  
WILLIAM J. entered into a copartnershi  
agreement to "merchandise together...in the town of  
Palmetto..., under the firm name of Garrett and  
Walthall to trade, barter, buy, sale & deal in genera  
merchandise." Mr. BOB HAMMILL, great-grea  
grandson of YOUNG GARRETT's sister  
ELIZABETH, lives in Palmetto, Ga. Th  
WATHALL's daughter married a Mr. BRITTAIN  
and their daughter married a Mr. HAMMILL. BOB  
lives in the family house on Toomes Street in  
Palmetto. The house was built by W.W.  
WATHALL in 1862.
