Hooper To all whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

K NOW YE, That in pursuance of an act of the General Assembly of said state, passed the Twenty-eighth day of March, in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy-eight; and of an Ordinance of the state aforesaid, passed the Twenty-sixth day of March, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty-four, for the purpose of securing and granting Land within this state to the Officers and Soldiers as therein set forth, We have granted, and by these presents do grant unto Absalom

Hooper's Soldier his heirs and assigns, a plantation or tract of land, containing one thousand two hundred acres

more or less him the Plaintiff, &c. to wit, situated in the District of Washington in Pendleton County on a branch of the Wallenney Creek bounded by lines running N E by Jacob Edens land S E H C Vacant lot by Zachariah Roberts



having such shape, form and marks as are represented by a plat hereunto annexed, together with all woods, trees, waters, water courses, profits, commodities, appurtenances and hereditaments whatsoever thereunto belonging, TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of ~~Two hundred~~ acres of land, and all and singular other the premises hereby granted unto the said ~~Absalom Hooper his~~ heirs and assigns, for ever in free and common socage.
