In the Name of God Amen on the day of <sup>the</sup> 9<sup>th</sup> December 1795  
I Andrew Coughran of the State of South Carolina and County  
of Abbeville planter Being Sick and weak in body but of present  
Mind and Memory thanks be given unto god therefore calling To  
Mind the Mortallity of my Body and knowing that it is appoint-  
ed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my Last  
will and Testament viz principally and first of all I gave and  
Recommend my Soul into the hands of the Almighty God that gave  
it and my Body I Recommend to the Earth to Be buried in decent  
Christian burial at the Discretion of my Executors nothing  
Doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall Receive the  
~~same power of god as touch~~ <sup>mighty power of god</sup> such  
worldly Estates as it hath pleased God in this Life to Bless  
me with I demise and dispose of the same in the following  
Manner and form - Impremise I give and bequeath to my beloved  
Son Andrew Coughran one hundred Acres of Land where he now Lives  
Also the old negro wench ~~and~~ those of the Horses and Cows al-  
ready in his possession and my Bed Sted and three Pounds  
Sterling I give and bequeath to my Dear and well Beloved Daugh-  
ter Reachel Patterson Six pounds Sterling and I likewise Give

Sterling and I leave and bequeath unto Ellenor Moreary Six  
pounds Sterling and I Leave and Bequeath unto My Grandson

My Daughter Jean McReary five Pounds Sterling and I leave unto  
Mary Little one guinea

my Boys to K Help to Raise them one third/ <sup>part</sup> of her time with John  
Beaty and the other Two parts of her time with Samuel Patterson
