ANN ELGIN

In the name of God amen. I Ann Elgin of Abbeville County and State a foresaid being well and in perfect mind and Memory calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that is appointed for all persons once to die do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament in the manner and form following (Viz) My soul I recommend into the hands of A Almighty God who gave it and my body I lieve to be decently entred at the discrecion of my Executors and as touching such worldly Estate as it has pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form--Imprimis my plantation whereon I now live which I got from Stephen Northcutt containing Two hundred acres and the lands thereunto adjoining runout in my own name I give and bequeath to my three Daughters Catharina Elgin Ann Elgin and Elisabeth Elgin to be equally divided bewteen them my Daughter Catharina to have her choice when divided my Will and desire is that that all the remanider part of my Estate be equally divided between Catharina -Ann & Elisabeth Elgin I do hereby Revoke and make void all former wills by me made and ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I hereunto set my hand Seal this twenty fifth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety one and of the Independence of the United States of North A merica the sixteenth --- Signed Sealed published and pronounced by the said Ann Elgin as her last Will and Testament who in the presence of each other subscribe our names thereto as Witnesses.
