in the Name of God Amen

Ann Lespine Roger Widdow, being sick of body but perfect senses of sound understanding do make ordain and Publish this my last will and testament. I recommend my soul to the Creator and my body to be decently enterr'd, and of my worldly goods and Estate I do dispose in the following manner. I will and ordain that my share of the Mill Tract whereon I now dwell, with the mill and such further buildings as are anyways belonging to it as likewise a Plantation or Tract of one hundred acres of Land situated in the fork between Savannah and little rivers, and one four Acre lot and also one of half an acre in the Town of New Bordeaux shall be divided Equally Between my three lawfull Children Namely-Peter Jeroniah and Mary Roger Share and there alike. I will and Bequeath unto my said daughter Mary Roger all and every part of the furniture, bedding and bedding clothes and all and Singular such other Effects as are in my said dwelling house or are in any ^{manner} thereto belonging. I also leave and bequeath unto my said daughter Mary the last and full sum of one hundred pounds Current Money of South Carolina to be pay'd. I further leave and bequeath unto said daughter Mary the black mare three year old or there about-- also one black cow branded and marked with my mark with all and Singular her increase I besides give leave and bequeath unto my said Daughter Mary One Spotted Cow with her female Calfs of last Spring and my two oldest sows and it is my will, and I Ordain that all and Singular my other personal Estate shall be equally divided between my three said lawfull Children Peter, Jeremiah, and Mary- ^{Share and share alike in the same manner as}

more, John Hixory, John Berard & Joseph Boughittien, Executor.
