I recommend my soul to the Creator and my body to be decently interred, and of my worldly goods and Estate I do dispose in the following manner. I will and ordain that my share of the mill Tract whereon I now dwell, with the mill and such further buildings as are anyways belonging to it as likewise a Plantation or tract of one hundred acres of land situated in the fork between Savanah and little rivers, and one four Acre lot and also one of half an acre in the Town of New Bordeaux shall be divided Equally Between my three lawfull Children Namely-Peter Jeromiah and Mary Roger Share and share alike. I will and Bequeath unto my said daughter Mary Roger all and every part of the furniture, bedding and bedding clothes and all and Singular such other Effects as are in my said dwelling house or are in any ^{manner} thereto belonging. I also leave and bequeath unto my ~~said~~ daughter Mary the last and full sum of one hundred pound Current Money of South Carolina to be pay'd. I further leave and bequeath unto said daughter Mary the black mare three year old or there about-- also one black cow brindled and marked with my mark with all and Singular her increase I besides give leave and bequeath unto my said Daughter Mary One Spotted Cow with her female Calfs of last Spring and my two oldest cows and it is my will, and I Ordain that all and Singular my other personal Estate to shall be equally divided between my three said lawfull Children Peter, Jeremiah, and Mary. I Leave and Bequeath unto my Son Peter Roger the sum of One hundred pounds Lawfull curr't Money of South Carolina to be pay'd to the same by my Executor in the same manner as those. To my Daughter and to this my last will and Testament - I do Appoint Patrick Calhoun Esq., James Hoomore, John Mimory, John Berana & Joseph Bouchittien, Executor.
