 worldly substance as it hath pleased god to bless me with in
 this Life I Leave and Bequeth the Same in maner and following I
 allow all my Just debts and ~~Charges~~ Charges to be paid and Cleared
 Imprimus and first of all I do allow my wife Angess McFarland the
 Plantation as long as She lives allowing she does not marry and if
 she marrys to have it no longer I all so allow my wife to have
 power to give what Stock she thinks proper to her three daughters
 as the stand in need and at my wifes death or marrage the plantat
 tion to be my Son Johns & his heirs & assigns forever and I
 allow my Son Charles to be paid of the Estate one dollar and
 no more as he would not stay by me; I allow my Son when the
~~plantation comes to~~ plantation comes to
 him to pay my daughter Marey Six pounds or Two likly Cows and Ca
 Calves- I do hereby revok Disanull and disallow all other wills
 by me heretofore made. Ratifying and allowing and confirming this
 and no other to be my last will. In witness whereof I have
 her etc set my hand and Seal this Seventh day of may 1796
