DANIEL GILL

In the Name of God Amen I Daniel Gill of Back River Congregation in the District of Abbeville South Carolina, planter being in health of Body and of Sound mind, memory and understanding prayed be God for the Same do make this my last will and testament in manner following--- 1st. I give and bequeath to my Son John one Dollar & to my Daughter Fanny one Dollar & 2nd-- My will and Disere is, that all My real and personal Estate of every kind be first sold, for the highest price that can be got for it, giving one years credit, and the proceeds of the sales when collected (after of Debts & Expenses Deducted) To be Equally Devided between my wife and my four last Childred. Viz To my well beloved wife Susanah Gill, one fifth part To my Son Ezekiel one fifth part To my Daughter Sarah one fifth part and to my Daughter Polley one fifth part. The Part that falls to my wife to be paid her as soon as collected after the bill & the Children Each to be paid when and as they attain their sevral and respective ages of twenty one yfars, or on the day of their respective marriages which shall first happen 3<sup>d</sup> if it shall be so, that my wife Susanah Gill shall hereafter alter her mind, and seek by law her third or whatever part Law may allow her, that the remainder be equally Divided amongst the four younger Children

4<sup>th</sup> -- if any one or more of the four younger Children should die, before the age of twenty one years their part shall be Divided equally amongst the remaining survivors

5th of the four young Children--- my will and mind is as above mentioned lands and slaves and stock & Abbeville County Wills 1787-1815

5th of the four young Children--- my will and mind is as above mentioned lands and slaves and stock & every other kind of Property be sold as aforesaid and to be given and Disposed of as herin before Directed after paying of all my just debts funera Expenses and the Expence of Proving this my will and I do make nominate, constitute, and appoint Samuel Linton, John Coldwell Esq & Thomas Franklin Executors of this my last will and testament; hereby revoking and making void all & every other will or will hereto fore by me made and do hereby declare this to be my last will & testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the fifth Day Decemb<sup>r</sup> Eighteen Hundred
