

WILL OF

GEORGE LIDDELL

The last will & Testament of George Liddell; dictated & declared by himself on Monday the Twenty eighth day of Decr. A. D. 1789. & committed to writing on Friday the First day of January A. D. 1790.

First that all his just debts be paid.

Next, that his wife Rachel may live on whichever of his plantations she pleases, & have the Negro wench Tab during fifteen years

Next, That his son James shall have the plantation on which the family now lives.

Next, That his son George Washington shall have the plantation by Sineco River

Next, that the child of which his wife is now pregnant, if a daughter, shall have his negro wench Tab; & that his Negro fellow Jame shall be sold in such a manner as the executors may judge to the best advantage, & his price divided equally among the three children: but if a son, he shall have the wench Tab & the whole price of Jame.

Next, That Capt. John Norwood shall see to a certain suit of him the said George Liddell, now depending in Abbeville Court.

Lastly, That Capt. John Norwood & Moses Liddell shall be executors of this his last will & testament.
