Yourthly I leave and bequeath to my Grand-son George Leviston Green the other third part and Remainder of all my Lands and moveable property. and I make and Exmake and ordain my Son in-law Robert Green and my Daughter Cathern his wife my Executor and Executrix to this my last will. And my desire is that Care may be taken to have all things performed and done according to my true Intent and meaning in witness whereof I the said George Leviston have to this my last filled Testament set my Hand and Seal, the Day and Year above-written. Signed, Sealed and delivered by the said George Leviston as and for his last will and Testament in the presence or us, who were present, at the Signing and Sealing George Livingston (Seal) thereof.
