I Will and bequeath unto my Daughter Jenny Colbert wife of Jesse Colbert Six cows and no calves as the value thereof My Will and desire is that my Negroe's Pink & Phoebe and her family to be sold. Unto my Son Robert I will my Stills, with the vessels and other appurtenances thereunto belonging- My outstanding debts to be collected, and any debts that I may at present owe to be PAID- At the death of my wife I will ask that a Sale take place of my personal Estate, that may not already be will away, (including Doll and her family) and that a fair equal and impartial division of the Nett proceeds of such sale together with what money may be left, of the money on hand and outstanding debts, after payment of my debts, amongst all my Children Male and Female, but the part or share that falls to my Daughter Peggy. I will to her Children & not to the use of her Husband, And it is further understood that any ~~black~~ improvements and additions that may be made to my personal estate by the care and industry of Robert and Hutson shall be to the advantage of them and the family living with them and not to be included in the bulk of my estate (the increase of my female Negroes if any excepted)- And I do hereby

John Weathersall, and my Son James Wardlaw Executors of this my last will and testament, hereby ratifying and confirming these three sheets of paper and no other to be my last will and Testament. IN TESTIMONY whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Ninth day of November in the yyear of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and two and of the independence of the United Sta tes of America the twenty seventh.
