In the Name of God Amen. I hugh Wilson of Abbeville County State of S. Carolina planter, being sick & Weak of Body, but Sound of Mind thanks be to God, and calling to remembrance the Mortality of my Body I have ordained this to be my last will and Testament; viz:

In the first place I recommend my Soul to God, and my Body to the Ground, to be buried decently at the direction of My Executors: And Secondly as to my temporal Estate with which it has pleased God to bless me in this World I leave & bequeath the Same in the Manner following

1st. I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Christian Wilson all & singular my personal property, ~~consisting in~~ ^{consisting in} ~~born~~ cattle, horses, hogs &c.

2^d And as to my real property consisting of one hundred ~~more~~ & twenty-five acres of land Situated~~&~~ lying in Abbeville County on Waters of Mill Creek, on which I live Now, it is my will that it ~~Should be divided equally Between my children, that is, between~~ My beloved Daughter Elenna & a child that My beloved wife is now pregnant with, if in case is born alive; and if in case any of my Said children Should Die under age or without any ~~lawful heirs~~ ^{lawful heirs} the whole Said tract of land shall belong to the one living And it is also my Will that the Said tract of land Shall not be Sold or divided till the youngest of the children comes of age or Married, but the land shall remain at the management of My Executor hereafter named.

And do name for Executrix of this my last will and Testament my said beloved wife Christian, and by this do revoke & annul any other former wills or Testaments whatsoever by ^{me} at any time
