 cuter hereafter mentioned, I give and Bequeath to my Son Joseph-
 Bealy one Hundred acres of Land of the plantation I now Live on
 a Joining to John Bowie plantation, Item I give Unto my son Na-
 thaniel Bealey the Remainder of my Plantation which is one hundred
 and twenty five acres, I give him all my horses
 Creators and Cows Except them after Mentioned, and -----
 Nathaniel Bealey is to Maintain and support his sister Isabell
 Bealey and Her horses and Cows as long as she Remains Unmarried,
 and I give and Bequeath Unto Nathaniel Bealy and Isabell Bealey all
 my house-hold furniture to be Equally Divided between them, Except
 the Crook and pot which is--Nathaniels own property, Item, I give
 Unto Jean Thakers my grand-daughter Jean Thaker one Cow and Calf
 and one steer known by the Name of Jean Thakers; and I Constitute
 and appoint my son Nathaniel Bealey to be my Executor of this my
 last Will and Testament, and I Revoke and disanul all former Wills
 and testaments, and I pronounce and Declair this to be my last
 Will and Testament this fourteenth Day of Februnry in the Year of
 our Lord--one Thousand seven hundred and Eighty-----
