JAMES GORLEY

In the name of God Amen, I James Gorley of Abbeville County Cambridge District State of South Carolina, farmer, ~~now~~ very sick & weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God; calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament; that is to say, principally and first of all, I give and recommend my Soul into the hand of almighty God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial, at the discretion of my Executors; Nothing doubting but at the general resurrection, I shall ~~see~~ ~~the same again~~, by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form--First I give and bequeath to my Brother Robert Gorley one hundred Acres of Land--also I give to my Brother Thomas Gorley my wear, and saddle, and Bridle, and spurs, and Bell, and two Buffals and a half of wheat--Also I give to my Brother in law Samuel Keene and James Fall a Note of five Pounds Starling to be equally divided between them, and Samuel Keene is to pay unto my Brother Hugh Gorley, one five Shillings Starling; and also I give Samuel Keene forty Buffals of Corn--And what is more of the Corn I giveth Robert Gorley--and I give up the note of thirty five bushels of corn. Also I give to Samuel Keene my Gardarey Brishes and two seven hundred Shirts and Samuel Keene if to pay Six Shillings Starling to Andrew Cochran--Also I give to my Brother Thomas Gorley two deerkins that is at little Alexander Whites and he is to pay two days work to him for frefing them and he is to pay to Joseph Hearft two days work--Also I give to David Hawthorn McCrea my Coate and Linnen Breesches and one Blanket--Also I give to Margaret McCrea my shear of the fodder and Punkens--Also I constitite make and ordain Alix. Smith and John Leggan to be the Executors of this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this ~~Septem~~ 1789

A Codicil to the above Will

Be it Known to all men by these present that I James Goorley
of A beeville County Cambridge district state of South Carolina
farmer have made and declared my last will and testament in
writing bearing date the seventeenth day of September 1788. The
said James Goorley by the present Codicil do ratify and confirm
my s^c last will and testament and do further give and bequeath
to my brother Thomas Goorley one pair of thread stockings and
one pair of woolen stockings and one silk handkerchief and one
pair of woolen mittens and that my brother Thomas do get one
pair of shoes that is at John Tullocks to be made paying for
the making of them--- Also that my brother Robert is to pay to
Margret McCready the sum of five Pounds Sterling for my funeral
Expenses and my will and meaning is that this Codicil be adjudged
to be a part and parcel of my last will and Testament and that
all things therein mentioned and contained be faithfully and
truly Performed as fully and amply in every respect as if the
same were so declared and set down in my said last will and
Testament. Witness my hand this 27th day of September 1788
