

WILL OF

JAMES LIDDELL

In the name of God Amen I James Liddell being in perfect health mind and memory but knowing the mortality of human life and calling to mind that it is appointed for all men once to die I do make constitute pronounce and Declear this to be my last will & testament - first I do will & bequeth my soul to the living god who gave it & my body to be decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors Secondly I will and bequeth this plantation which I now live on containing two hundred acres more or less and one hundred acres more nearly Joyning line it - being the remaining part of two hundred acres one hundred I sold to Daniel Kith to my son John Liddell but to my Dearley beloved wife Esther Liddell I bequeath ~~the~~ living off the said plantation during life and two cows and calves at hir own Disposal - thirdly to my daughter Elener & Ferrata Liddells Child of the same name I do bequeath two hundred acres of land viz: the plantation whereon Gerrat Liddell formerly lived to be Equally Devided between them and all the goods and chattels belonging to the plantation I leave to my son John Liddell and his mother fifthly I leave to George Liddells son James one cow and calf & oneewe & lambe and to Mathew Robersons son James I also leave one cow and to Moses Liddells son James I do leave one cow & calf Sixtly to my other sons and daughters I do will & bequeth as follows vez. to Daniel Kith Andraw Liddell Moses Liddell James martin and matthew Robison one Shilling Starling Bach and I do also order & bequeth that when all necessary Charges & Expenses are Depaid and the above Leagues paid if any part of the worldly goods which I am possessed of may yet Remain undisposed off I hereby bequeath the same to my son John Liddell

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hearby bequeath the same to my son John Liddell to helpe to
Support ^{my} beloved wife During hir life - and I do further order
and Bequeth and appoint that my dearely beloved wife Esther
Liddell & John Liddell and Robert Anderson Require and moses
Liddell to be the Executors of this my last will and testament and
I do heereby Diswon Disanull and Revoke all former wills and
testaments and I do hereby Declare this to be my last will
and testament in witness whereof I have heereinto set my hand
and seal this 6 day of July 1791
