JAMES T. DODD

In the name of God Amen I James Liddell being in perfect health
mind and memory but knowing the mortality of human life and
calling to mind that it is appointed for all men once to die
I do make constitute pronounce and Declear this to be my last
will & testament - first I do will & bequeath my soul to the
living god who gave it & my body to be decently buried at the
Discretion of my Executors Secondly I will and bequeath this
plantation which I now live on containing two hundred acres more
or less and one hundred acres more nearly Joyning lies it - being
the remaining part of two hundred score one hundred I sold to
Daniel Kith to my son John Liddell but to my Dearley beloved
wife Esther Liddell I beongath & living off the said planta-
tion during life and two cows and calve at hir own Disposal -
thirdly to my daughter Ellener & Ferrata Liddells Child of the same
name I do bequeath two hundred acres of land viz: the plantation
whereon Gerrat Liddell formerly livid to be Equally Devided
between them and all the goods and chatties belonging to the
plantation I leave to my son John Liddell and his mother fifty
- I leave to George Liddells son James one cow and calf & one he-
ifer & lambe and to Mathew Robisons son James I also leave one cow
and to Moses Liddells son James I do leave one cow & calf
Sixtly to my other sons and daughters I do will & bequeath as fol-
lows viz. to Daniel Kith Andrew Liddell Moses Liddell James
Martin and Matthew Robison one Shilling Starling Each and I do
also order & bequeath that when all necessary Charges & Expenses
are Depaid and the above Leagues paid if any part of the worldly
goods which I am possessed of may yet remain undisposed off I
hearby bequeath the same to my son JoAbbeville County Wills 1787-1815
