all that Tract or Tracts of Land--- Whereon I Now Live Containing  
between four & five hundred Acres With the Mills & all to be  
Under the direction & In the Possession of my wife Untill the  
Youngest Surviving Child comes of age. or She continues a Widow  
Then the Property to be put to Sale Either Publick or private at  
the discretion of my Executors.

Then the Property to be put to Sale Either Publick or private at  
the discretion of my Executors.

8th It is my will that my Executors sell such part or parts of  
the perishable property as Necessity shall require --- they  
Consulting my Wife on all such occasions

9. & In Case my Widow should marry then & in that case  
as they think proper  
the Executors to sell such part or parts of the personal Estate/  
& the Money arising therefrom to be put to Interest for the use
