I John Brownlee of the District of ninety six in the State of South Carolina Abbeville County being weak in Body but of Sound and perved memory, praise be given to God for the same, and knowing the uncertainty of this life on Earth, and being desirous to settle things in order do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form Following that is to say, first and principally I Commend my Soul to Almighty God my Creator Assuredly believing that I shall reveive full pardon and free remission of all my sins, and be saved by the precious ~~blood~~ merits of my Blessed Savior and Redeemer Christ Jesus and my Body to the Earth from whence it was taken to be Buried in such Decent and Christian manner as my Executors hereafter named shall think meet and Convenient and as Touching such worldly Estate as the Lord in mercy hath lent me my Will and meaning is the same shall be employ'd and bestowed as hereafter by this my Last Will expresseth and first I do revoke, Renounce, Frustrate and make void all wills be me formerly made and declared and do appoint this my last will and Testament Item I give and Bequeath unto my dear and Loving Wife Alley Brownlee two Negroes named Susanna and Harry together with all the stock, plantatkon tools and Moushold furniture during her Life and after her death the Stock to be equally ~~xxx~~ Divided between my son Joseph Brownlee and my Daughter Nancy Richey, Item I give and bequeath unto m<sup>r</sup> s<sup>n</sup> Son Joseph Brownlee ~~and~~ my Death my Waggon and giers and all the shop tools. and Bequeath unto my s<sup>d</sup> Daughter Nancy Richey after my Death  
Two hundred Dollars made up with what her husband now has in his  
hands as soon as it can be Collected. Item I give and Bequeath  
unto my Grandson Joseph Richey at my Death what money I lent him  
also my Big Bible Item I give and bequeath unto my s<sup>d</sup> son Joseph  
Brownlee at my Death Three Hundred and fifty six Dollars in Due  
of the Land I sold Doctor Thomas Taylor and after my Wifes Death  
the Two negroes are to be free in case the s<sup>d</sup> Harry is Twenty  
years old, otherwise he is to be put in the hands of my

afores<sup>d</sup> son Joseph Brownlee till he arrives to the age of twenty one and at my wifes Death I also give the s.<sup>d</sup> Two Negroes one hundred and thirteen acres of Land Laying on Turkey. I do hereby be sold my my s<sup>d</sup> son Joseph Brownlee and Land to be Bought convenient to him with the purchase thereof and for him to Conduct and manage for the s.<sup>d</sup> two negroes .Item I give and bequeath unto my s.<sup>d</sup> son Joseph Brownlee at my Death all my Clothes both made and unmade, and I do hereby Constitute appoint and ordain my Lovig Wife Alley Brownlee and my s.<sup>d</sup> son Joseph Brownlee and George Brownlee sen<sup>r</sup>, Executors of this my Last Will and Testament Revoking all will formerly made by me and this only to be taken for my last will in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year first above written
