

JOHN CAMPBELL

In the name of God amen the thirteenth day of July 1786 I John Campbell of Ninety Six District in Abbeville County Farmer, being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory, thanksgiving unto God, therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my body, and knowing, that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament: that is to say, principally and first of all, I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that give it; and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent christian burial, at the discretion of my executors: And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner. First I give and bequeath unto my three sons all my Land equally divided among them. Secondly I give unto my two Daughters; two cows and calves the red rigged Cow to Easter and the Coffetown Cow to Mary; and the remainder of all my Cattle and Goods I allow to be equally divided among the whole only the schooling of the two youngest sons is to be reduced from the whole after all my debts and funeral charges are paid. Lastly I allow all my clothes to my sons, and all my Wifes Clothes to my Daughters; and the pewter to be deviced equally among the whole: And I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former testaments wills leggacies and bequests and executors, by me in any ways before named willed and bequeathed, ratifiing and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and year above written; I leave George Conn Adam Hill and Robert Smith as my sole executors.
