horse when my debts is paid. Item I do also allow that my bead
Divided equially amongst william and robert and gean and susanna
also one sugar cannis I give unto my sister gean and one frying
pan I give unto my sister susanna likewise * give unto my
brother william three pare of drawing chanes and one plow
I likewise do appoint that my two brothers robert and william
should be my executors over my estate in witne whareof I set
my hand and seal this eighth day of January and in the year of our
lord one thousand eight hundred and three
