JOHN WHITE

In the Name of God, A men, I John White of Abbeville County & State of S.^c Carolina, Being very sick And Weak in body but of perfect Memory thanks be Given to God; Calling unto mind the Moratlity of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men one to die, do make and Ordain this my last Will And Testament, that is to say principally and first of all, I give and Recommend my Soul Unto the hand of Almighty God that Gave it, and my Body I Recommend to the Earth to be Buried in a Decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors, Nothing doubting, but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the same again, by the mighty power of God. And as touching such Worldly Estate where with it has Pleased God to bless me in this Life, I Give, Bequeath, and Dispose of the same in the following manner & form

First, I give and Bequeath to Agness, my Dearly Beloved Wife, all my movable property, also all debts Due to me (Except fifteen pound Sterling here after mentioned) to be Disposed of, by her at her pleasure, to her and my Children and Grand Child. Vis James, Sarah, Margret and Jannet White, also Agness Lesly) of continuing in a state of Widowhood, but if she marries then she is to have one one sixth part of the above mentioned property and Debts, and the other five parts to be Equally divided between my above mentioned Childerling and Grand Child by my Executors herein after Mentioned

Also I give to my well beloved Son James White The plantation or Tract of Land I now live on, by him freely to be possessed and enjoyed (Except that during my Wife Agness's Widowhood she is to have Maintainance of said Plantation or tract of Land and no longer) also I Give and Bequeath
