It is my Will that my beloved Wife Susannah Bouchillon Shall enjoy the incomes of my Whole Estate during her life or Widowhood; after her Death of Second Marriage, It is my Will that my Land shall belong to my Two Sons # John, & Joseph Leonard, and to their Heirs for ever to be divided equally among them; and as to my personal property. I dispose of it in the following Manner. I give & bequeath the half of it to my Daughter Tenny and the remainder to be divided between my two Sons after the death of my Wife or Second Marriage. And it is my Will that my portion of Negro Bill should be paid to my Wife Susannah or that the rent of him shall be paid to her, till the money is paid, which I leave to the option of my Brother John Bouchillon, this 30th of November Anno Domini one thousand Eight hundred & two.
