I give up my soul to god, which is his due, in Hopes of a blessed resurrection thro' the merits of my dear redeemer 2ndly I dispose of what it has been his mercy to send me as Follows, (To wit) Item I give & bequeath to my grandson Robert Shanklin, all my land that I possess at this time or have any claim to, to Him care hiers forever, but with this perticular proviso that wife Mary Searingen shall have the one third of the said land, during her natural life unmolested by anmone, and at her decease he is to take possession of the whole, Item I lend my dear & beloved wife mary, all my personal Metate during her natural life and at her decease, it is my will desire, that it be equally devided between my Two daughters, Sarah Pekins, Hannah Bhanklin, Latte John Thompson, & John Thompson, (That is to aly) one third to my daughter Barah Pakins, & her Hiera forever, one third to my daughter Hanah Shanklin, & her hiers forever, and the other one third remaining to be equally devided between my Three grandsons Matthew Thompson Joseph Thompson, and John Thompson, to them & thier Hiers forever, Item give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Barrett one dollar to her and her hiers forever Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Thompson one dollar to her & heirs forever, Item I appoint and Constitute my beloved wife Mary Swearingen, my Exetrix together with my son in Law Thomas Shanklin, my Executor, to this my last will & Testimant revoking and annulling all wills, whatsoever by the hertofore made, as Witness my Hand & seal this Fourteenth day of July one thousand seven Hundred & ninety four
