Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Agnes Wardlaw my house and one fourth part of all my lands ajoining thereto dureing her life Item give unto my wife all my took negroes household an citchen furniture during her life or widowhood but if she should marray these transfer to the furniture to be sold and the money equally devided betwix my wife and all my children thos of my children that is already maned what I have given them already shall be record in then parts of my estate Item It is my desire that my lands shall be equally devided betwix all my sons William John 'liss and James my son' James to have his part adjoining the hous whearin I now live if my wife should dy before she should marray then all the negros stock housnold and citchen furniture to be sold and the money equally devided betwix all my thridren item alve unto my son John all my black smith tools and them to be reckend in his part of my estate I give unt my daughter maray a frunk which shall be recipd in her part of my estate Item It is my desire that my daughter shal is not maned if they should marray in my wifes life or widowhood that as they marray they shall have a hors and saddle a fether bed and -bed cloths and two cows out of my estate and that to be rekend in three parts of my estate
