ANDREW LOGAN

In the Name of God Amen. I Andrew Logan of Abbeville County and State of South Carolina being very Sick and Weak in body but of perfite mind and memory; calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament: that is to say first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hand of God that give it, and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly estate wherewith I am pleased to be blessed I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form: viz.

First I give and Bequeath to Lidy my dearly beloved wife a ll my moyable affects that I am at this time possessed of and Likewise the use and benifit of the Plantation I now live on during hur lifetime for hur Conforte and Report

Also I give unto my beloved Son John Logan five pound which is to be livead out of my Estate

Also unto Isaac Logan my well beloved Son one hundred acres of Land the Same that he is now in pussion of

Also unto William Heard my beloved Newfee one hundred acres of Land the Same that I now live on which he is not to receive untill his grainmothers daith

And I do hereby ratify and confirm this and no oither to be my last will and testament. Appointing and constiating

Lydia my beloved wife my Execuatrix together with John

Wardlaw my Executor in witness wherof I have hereunto

Sete my hand and Seal this twinty fifth day of August in the Year one thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Night.
