District, Being weak of Body, but of sound and perfect,  
mind and memory blessed be God, And Calling to mind immortal  
State and that it is appointed unto all men to die do make  
and publish this my last will and Testament, in manner and  
form following that is to say, First of all I recommend my  
Soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it, and my Body  
I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian  
Burial, at the discretion of my Executors, Nothing Doubting  
but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same  
again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such world-  
ly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life  
I give, Demise, and dispose of, the same in the following man-  
ner, and first I give and bequeath unto my Brother Finnes Toy,  
Fifteen Dollars, Secondly, I give and bequeath unto Margery  
Conn, Daughter of George Conn Eighteen dollars, I give and  
bequeath unto Josiah Patterson Sen' ~~seventy-five~~ Dollars, I  
give and Bequeath unto Abraham Little the Husband of my Niece  
Hannah One Hundred Dollars, and the remainder of My Estate  
whether in ready Money, Bonds, Notes, &c, personal, Household Furn-  
iture or I give and Bequeath unto the above Abraham Little s.  
Three children Margery, John, and Abraham, To be my Executors,  
hereafter to be named divided into Three equal shares, and by  
them paid unto the Said Three Children aforesaid, - (with the  
Interest that may arise therein) as they become of age, or on  
their day of Marriage, and if any of the said children Should  
die in marriage I will and desire that their respective share or  
shares, should pass to the child or children as the case may be  
that may hereafter be born unto the <sup>Abbeyville Wills 1784-1815</sup>  
said niece Hannah and in case of failure of issue as above

Three children Margery, John, and Abraham, To be my Executors,  
hereafter to be named divided into Three equal Shares, and by  
them paid unto the Said Three Children aforesaid, - (with the  
Interest that may arise therein) as they become of age, or on  
their day of Marriage, and if any of the said children Should  
die in marriage I will and desire that their respective share or  
Shares, should pass to the child or children as the case may be  
that may hereafter be born unto the said Abraham Little, by my  
said niece Hannah and in case of Failure of Josue as afores-  
aid to be at the disposal of said Abraham Little, and lastly  
I constitute and appoint, Josiah Patterson and Abraham Little  
both above named the lawful Executors of this my last will and  
Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and  
seal this 23 day of November AD 1801 -
