I Martha Davis (the widow of Rob<sup>t</sup> Davis deceas<sup>d</sup>.) do make my last will in the following manner-- 1st-- I leave & bequeath to my sons Robert & James the Plantation ~~land~~ <sup>live upon</sup> (including the Mill ) provided they do pay unto my younger Son Samuel a sum of money equal to the value of one third part of s<sup>d</sup> Land. But in case my Sons Robert & James, do not pay to my Son Samuel money equal to the value of one third s<sup>d</sup> Tract or plantation as soon as he comes to be of age; then it is my will that Samuel shall have a right in s<sup>d</sup> Land equal to either his Brother Robert or James----

2<sup>d</sup> I leave & bequeath unto my Daughter Martha one hundred Dollars to be paid out of my personal Estate. Also ~~it is~~ <sup>is</sup> my Will that my Daughter Martha shall have as great privileges upon the plantation I have given my Sons, while she continues unmarried as she now enjoys----

3<sup>d</sup> I leave & bequeath unto my Daughter Mildridge what ever of my Estate she has in her hands---

4th I leave & bequeath unto my Son Israel & my Daughters Margaret Jean, & Rebecca, forty dollars; to each an equal share----

5th The Balance of my personal Estate, I leave & bequeath to my Sons Robert, James, & Samuel provided never the less that my lawful Debts shall be first paid out of it---

6th I do ~~haxxy~~ declare the above to be my last Will & do appoint my Son Robert Executor of the same--
