I mary Sayral, widow of John Bayle of Hillsborough Township, being sick lish and Weak, but of a perfect Mind and Memory thanks ~~to~~ given unto God, calling unto Mind the mortality of My body, & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will & Testament, that is to say-- principally and first of all; I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of God that give it, and my body I recommand to the Earth, to be buried in a decent Christian burriale, at the discretion of my Executors: Nothing Doubting but at the ~~general~~ general Resurrection, I shall receive the same again, by the Mighty Power of God.

And as touching such Worldly State, ~~wherein it is pleased God to~~ bless me in this life, I give demise, & dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

I give & bequeath to my well beloved Son Peter Bayle Planter of hills borough Township & to my well beloved daughter Cecille Bayle Wife of Peter Moragne Planter in the said hillsborough, whom likewise Constitute, make & ordain the sole Heirs and Executors of this my last will and Testament, all & Singular my Estate, wich Consist in Land, House-- Household gouds, Tools, by them freely to be possessed and enjoyed; in the folowing Manner: that is, I give & bequeath to my beloved Son Peter Bayle a ~~lot~~ vineyard lot in the french Square at new Bordeaux containing four Acres of land, & a Town lot Containing half an acre, also a feather bed & some small tools that he has received in my living.

2. I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Cecille Bayle a plantation or a piece of ground Containing a hundred Acres of land in hillsborough, Township Confronted on the North east by the 1787-1815 land & on the South West by the land of the said Peter Moragne. My

2.^o I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Cecille Bayle a plantation or a piece of ground Containing a hundred Acres of land in hillsborough, Township Confronted on the North east by the Glebe land & on the South West by the land of the said Peter Moragne My son in Law & all the appartenences Whatsoever: & also all my household goods, furniture & Tools, Whatever And for my beloved son Francis Bayle Taylor in Charles Town I give him a seven & six Pence & a glace of Water to be paid to him by my Heirs & Executors at his request,

And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke, and disanull all and every
