And I give and bequeath to my Loving sister Elinor that fifty Acres of Land where she lives during herwidewhood and my Large Gray horfe and her Bread from the Mill for this seafon and ten Pound Sterig to be paid out of my Estate & I give and bequeath to my loving Sifter Martha ten Pounds alfe to be paid out of my Eftate, & a ll the remainderof my other eftate to be seld and the Moneys arifing from said_sale_to_be equally divided between my goving wife and my two beloved children and I Will and order that the Grist Mill be let out and kept in good repair, and what benefits arifes from her to be for the benefit and use of my second Child, and also I will and erder that all my lawful debts be punctually paid, also I give and Bequeath to my Leving Brother -law James Cochran Abbeville Cortille Aptize 2 1868 father www.southcarolinapioneers.com
