GEORGE MORROW

In the Name of God Amen I George Morrow of Abbeville County in the State of South Carolina Planter, being Weak in body but of sound Mind and Memory (blesed be God) do this Day Make & Publish this my Last Will and Testament in Manner and form following (That is to say) Imprimus. after My Lawfull debts & Funeral Expences are discharged, I Give and bequeath to My Loving Wife Mary Morrow an Equal share of all my Personal Estate (after the part that is left to My son John & my daughter Jane is Taken out) That is to say an Equal part with My four other Children to be at her disposal, likewise My best Hat, and it is my Will that she have the use of the Plantation on which I now live and my Grist Mill (Except the part of the profits as My Executors May allow my son John) During her widowhood (and no longer) and likewise the Part of Each Child Shall Remain with there Mother til they are of age or Marry to Innable her to Scool and educate them.

Item I give and bequeath to My Son Hugh Morrow one Hundred acres of land to be laid of the south side of the land on which I live Item I give and bequeath to My son John Morrow a bay Colt saddle & bridle and a Rifle gun and if he stay with his Mother and assist in supporting the younger Children It is My will that My Executors allow him something suffittiant for his Incourage-ment out of the profits of the Plantation & Mill during the Time he stays

Item I give and bequeath to My daughter Jane a Sorrel Horse, saddle & spinning wheel, a Chest, a bed and Furniture

It is my will that all My stocke of Horses Cattle sheep Hogs and all my movable property that is not disposed above be Equally divided between My Wife Mary Morrow, My Daughter Margaret Morrow, My daughter Mary Ann Morrow & my sons Geore Mecklin Morrow, and my son James. Except My wearing apparrel, I allow to My son George Mecklin Morrow and it is My will that the Plantation I now live on shall be Equally dededed between my Two sons George Mecklin Morrow and My son James, and I do hereby Constitute and appoint My beloved wife Mary Morrow, William Hutton & John Pettigrew
