SAMUEL PATTERSON

In the Name of God amean the third day of March 1793 I Samuel Patterson of the County of Abbeville and of Long Cain Settlement Planter being very Sick and weake in Body but of perfect mind and Memory thanks be given Unto God therefore Calling unto mind the Mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to Die; Do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all, I give and Recommend my Soul into the hand of Almighty God that gave it and my body I Recommend to the Earth to be Buried in Deasent Christian burial at the Decoration of My Executors Nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection I Shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God and as touching such ~~my~~ Estate ~~whereon I have lived~~ God to bless Me in this life I Give Demis and Dispose of the same in the following manner and form viz---

First I hereby Bequeath unto my Spouse Mary a black mare & the young Colt to Peggy paterson with five pounds sterlinc to buy her a saddle & bridle & that my spouse shall have the whole household furniture I possess & that said mare & colt shall be duly fed from the produce of my farm or any in her room so long as my Spouse pleaueth & that said Colt be fed out of my farm for five years from the date only also one beding of Clothes to Peggy Also one A lso one beding of Clothes to Each of my Sons Josia & James.

2<sup>ly</sup> I hereby bequeath to ~~Samuel~~ <sup>Micah</sup> paterson Fifty acres of land with the fifty he now posseseth - Said firy acres I mean in that which lys on the west side of the wagon road going from Wallace's to Deasach's old place also a <sup>note of four hundred</sup> weight of Tobacco.

2<sup>d</sup>ly I hereby bequeath to ~~Peggy~~ <sup>Mary</sup> paterson Fifty acres of land  
with the fifty he now posseseth - Said fifty acres I mean in  
that which lys on the west side of the wagon road going from  
Wallace's to Desacha's old place also a note of four hundred  
weight of Tobacco from Texomy Rogers. also the remainder of my  
farm to be equally Divided between my said sons Josias & James  
likewise to Josias my son my horse called Herod & to my son  
James my horse called Prince.

3<sup>d</sup>ly I bequeath & direct all my black Cattle Sheep & Swine to  
be equally divided between my spouse Josias & James aforesaid &  
Margaret my Dauf with their increase also that my said sons  
James & Josias shall have equal shares of all my

(6thly) I bequeath further unto Mary my spouse my dwelling house & stable for her horse also with my largest Bible. My Margin Bible to my son John likewise all the remainder of my Books to my spouse & my Dauf<sup>r</sup> Peggy & my said sons James & Josias in equal division (6thly) Also I bequeath to my Dauf<sup>r</sup> Mary one Cow & Calf out of said Stock of black Cattle & to my Dauf<sup>r</sup>. Sarah one Cow & Calf and to my Daughter Jean twenty bushels of Indian Corn also the Saddle my Spouse has used for some time past I direct her to kepp still for her own use & the other two Saddles that is my own that I used to Josias & the other to James Paterson. (6thly) I appoint all debts that I owe & funeral charges to be paid out of said Estate & what other Debts not yet mentioned & owing to me I devise to be my Executors laid out in equal divisions & given to my spouse & my said two sons Josias & James & finally I direct and appoint William McGaw John McGaw my faithful Executors to see that all my said bequeathments be duly managed & executed as I have directed in this & in the former page of my last Will & Testament. In Witness where of I have hereunto set my hand & Seal upon this 3<sup>d</sup> day of March 1791 aforesaid Sealed & delivered in presence of  
us Thos Clark
