JAMES SEAWRIGHT

I James Seawright of Abbeville County and State of South Carolina being Sick and weak in Body but of Perfect Mind and memory Calling to mind the Mortality of the Body and knowing that it is appointed for allment once to Die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament That is to Say I recommend my Soul into the hand of God who give it and my body to the Earth to be Burried decently at the Discretion of my Executors; As touching such worldly goods as it has pleased God to bless me with in this life I give and dispose of the Same in the following maner and form-- I give and bequeath to Each of my Children one horse and one Cow the oldest to Make the first Choise the Second oldest the next and so on to the youngest My Land and Negroes together with my Plantation Tools and Household furniture I leave for the Support and Raising of my famaly and when the famaly is Raised or Come to years of Maturity then the Land and Negroes to be Equally divided amongst my Children by and at the discretion of my Executors; the Remender of my Estate not Mentioned above to be Sold and equally Divided amongst my Childen by my Executors I do hereby ordain and appoint my friend Samuel Agnew and Hugh Wardlaw Executors of this my last Will and Testament: Ratefying and Confirming this and no other to be my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have here unto Set my hand and Seal this Twentyninth Day of October One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eightynine
