

WILL OF
WILLIAM SHAW

In the Name of God Amen. December 11th 1784-----

I William Shaw of the State of South Carolina, and County of Abbeville being weak of Body, but of perfect Mind, and Memory do make and constitute this my Last Will and Testament.

Imprimis I give and bequeath the sum of twenty one Pounds eighteen Shillings, which is due to me from William Stephens of the Chioocas to my dearly beloved Mother now living in Maryland.

Item I disire that the Bond of Ten Pound Maryland Currency, in the Possession of Robert Shaw may be appropriated to the paying of any debts I may owe and the remainder (if any) be given to my father having first paid Thomas Hewitt a sum of forty five shillings, odd pence, and the sum of fifty odd Shillings to Francis Lowndes . Likewise the sum of nine Shillings and one penny I owe to one Counts a Taylor in Bladen'sburgh which to the best of my knowledge is all I owe, and two Dollars towards building a Meeting house in this settlement.

Item I give and bequeath to M^r. Hauskinson my blue Coat if he accepts of it-----

Item to Robert Shaw I give all the rest of my wearing Apparel---

I do therefore appoint and constitute Patrick Calhoun Esq^r and the said M^r. Hauskinson to be the Executors of this my Last Will, and Testament. hereby revoking all others, and appointing and ordaining this my Last Will, and Testament-- Signed Seal'd and pronounced
