I Susana Maxfield Being weak in Body But in sound mind and memory do make this my last will and Testme in manner following Viz-- after my Burial expences, and just debt to be paid, I do will and bequeath as follows--- I give to my Loving Daughter Jeen my spinning wheel two pewterplates and one iron pot to be for the Benefit of her Daughter "agnes--- Also I give to my loving Daughter Elizabeth one Bay Horse one Brown Cow and calf one feather bed and furniture one hunting saddle and Bridle one spinning wheel one pewter-dish fpur pewter plates and half of all the earthen ware--- I also give to my loving Daughter Nancy one sorrel Horse one Fleeked cow and calf one feather bed and furniture one hinting saddle and Bridle. one spinning wheel one pewter dish and four plates and one half of all the earthen ware---

I also give to my loving Son William one Horse called Buck and if found necessary to be sold by the Executor. also one new Saddle one Brindled Heifer--- also I will and order that all the remainder of my Estate be sold at publick vendue at a reasonable credit Excepting the corn and wheat. which is to be kept for the benifit of the family--- and I do further ordain Constitute and appoint my trusty friends John Herston & Peter Herston my lawful Executors of this my last will and testament and I do hy these presents pyblishe and declare this to be my last will and testmend.
