iron pot to be for the Benefit of her Daughter Agnes--- Also I
give to my loving Daughter Elizabeth one Bay Horse one Brown Cow
and calf one feather bed and furniture one hunting saddle and
Bridle one spinning wheel one pewter-dish four pewter plates
and half of all the earthen ware--- I also give to my loving
Daughter Nancy one sorrel Horse one Fleeced cow and calf one
feather bed and furniture one hinting saddle and Bridle. one
spinning wheel one pewter dish and four plates and one half of all
the earthen ware---

I also give to my loving Son William one Horse called Buck and if
found necessary to be sold by the Executor. also one new Saddle
one Brindled Heifer--- also I will and order that all the remainder
of my Estate be sold at publick vendue at a reasonable credit
Excepting the corn and wheat. which is to be kept for the benifit
of the family--- and I do further ordain Constitute and appoint
my trusty friends John Herston & Peter Herston my lawful Executors
of this my last will and testment and I do by these presents
publish and declare this to be my last will and testment.

the undersubscribing Witnesses this tenth day of Sept^r 1793-
