Thomas Winn, of the County and

State aforesaid, being mindful, of the frailty and morality
of Humane Nature do hereby make this my last Will and Testa-
ment, in the manner and form following

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Letice Winn
Two Negroe Women known by the Name of Judah and Hieah, also one
bay Horse (known by the name of Bandy) Saddle and bridle for
ever, Also I lend to my beloved Wife all my Stock, (Viz)
Horses, Cattle, Hogs, Sheep, and Geese, exclusive of Two fols;
for the Support of the Two younger Children, Lettice, and
Robert, dureing, her life of Widerhood, Also the Plantation
whereon I now reside untill her death, and then to be Equally
divided between, my Two younger Children Lettice and Robert
Either by lot, or Sold at their disoression, and if either of
the Children should die for the whole to fall to the other, Also
all the Plantation Utensils, together with the Carpenters and
Joiners Tools, Also a Bond of M.^o Gleens for the Sum fifty Eight
pounds six shillings and Eight pence with Interest, Also, the
present years Crop of Tobacco and Cprn, Also it is to be ob-
served that my just Debts are to be paid, Item I give and
bequeath unto my daughter Letice Winn, Two Negroe men by the
name of Jacob and Melo, also one bay Colt known by the Name of
Buckscin, also a reasonable part of the Stock at the time shee
may leave her Mother, also One Feather Bed and furniture -
Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Robert Winn Two Negroe
Men by the Name of Aaron and Homida, Also one Black Horse Colt,
one Feather Bed and furniture, and a Reasonable Part of the

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Letice Winn Two Negroe Women known by the Name of Judah and Hieah, also one bay Horse (known by the name of Bandy) Saddle and bridle for ever, Also I lend to my beloved Wife all my Stock, (Viz) Horses, Cattle, Hogs, Sheep, and Geese, exclusive of Two foltz; for the Support of the Two younger Children, Lettice, and Robert, during, her life of Widderhood, Also the Plantation whereon I now reside untill her death, and then to be Equally divided between, my Two younger Children Lettice and Robert Either by lot, or Sold at their discession, and if either of the Children should die for the whole to fall to the other, Also all the Plantation Utensils, together with the Carpenters and Joiners Tools, Also a Bond of M^o Gleens for the Sum fifty Eight pounds six shillings and Eight pence with Interest, Also, the present years Crop of Tobacco and Corn, Also it is to be observed that my just Debts are to be paid, Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Letice Winn, Two Negroe men by the name of Jacob and Melo, also one bay Colt known by the Name of Bucksin, also a reasonable part of the Stock at the time shee may leave her Mother, also One Feather Bed and furniture -

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Robert Winn Two Negroe Men by the Name of Aaron and Homida, Also one Black Horse Colt, one Feather Bed and furniture, and a Reasonable Part of the Stock that may be remaining when he arrives to be of lawful Age, my desire is that Letice and Robert be well Educated.- Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Abner Winn the Tract of land whereon he now lives, containing one hundred and fifty Acres, more or less; Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Elemuel Winn one half of the Tract of Land whereon he now resides, the deviding line begining on Greens line on the branch, thence a stait line out to the back line towards Words; Item I give and be-

queath unto my Son Thomas Winn forty pounds thats in the hands
of my Brother Banister Winn Item, I give and bequeath unto my
Son Elisha Winn the Money that due me out of my Brother
Washington Winns Estate in Luninburgh County in Virginia. - Item
I give and bequeath unto my Son Richard Winn the other part or
half of the Tract of Land whereon Elemeul now resides, also One
Feather Bed and Some furniture; Item I give and bequeath unto
my daughters Sarah and Elizabeth Winn the money thats in my
Brother William Winn hands, a part thats owing by a Judgment thats
Confessed in Abbeville Court the balance thats due to be equally
divided between the aforesaid Two Girls Sarah and Elizabeth. -
Lastly I appoint my Wife Letice Winn Executrix and Jn^o. M. and
James Carter Executors of this my last Will and Testament whereof
I have hereunto sett my hand and Seal this thirty first day of
October 1796. -
