THOMAS WINN In the Name of God amen, I State of South Carolina Thomas Winn, of the County and Abbeville County State aforesaid, being mindful, of the frailty and morality of Humane Nature do hereby make this my last Will and Testament, in the manner and form following I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Letice Winn Two Negroe Women known by the Name of Judah and Hieah, also one bay Horse (known by the name of Bandy) Saddle and bridle for ever, Also I lend to my beloved Wife all my Stock, (Viz) Horses, Cattle, Hogs, Sheep, and Geese, exclusive of Two folts; for the Support of the Two younger Children, Lettice, and Robert, dureing, her life of Widerhood, Alcorbe Plantation whereon I now reside untill her ceath, and then to be Equally divided between, my Two younger Children Lettice and Robert Either by lot, or Sold at their discression, and if either of the Children should die for the whole to fall to the other, Also all the Plantation Utensils, together with the Carpenters End Joiners Tools, Also a Bond of M. Gleens for the Sum fifty Hight pounds six shillings and Right pence with Interest, Also, the present years Crop of Tobacco and Corn, Also it is to be ubserved that my just Debts are to be paid, Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Letice Winn, Two Negroe men by the name of Jacob and Melo, also one bay Colt known by the Name of Buckscin, also a reasonable part of the Stock at the time shee may leave her Mother, also One Feather Bed and furniture -I give and bequeath unto my Son Robert Winn Two Negroe Men by the Name of Aaron and Homida, Also one Black Horse Colt,

Gleens for the Sum fifty Bight pounds six shillings and Right pence with Interest, Also, the present years Crop of Tobacco and Corn, Also it is to be observed that my just Debts are to be paid, Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Letice Winn, Two Negroe men by the name of Jacob and Melo, also one bay Colt known by the Name of Buckscin, also a reasonable part of the Stock at the time shee may leave her Mother, also One Feather Bed and furniture -Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Robert Winn Two Negroe Men by the Name of Aaron and Homida, Also one Black Horse Colt, one Feather Bed and furniture, and a Reasonable Part of the Stock that may be remaining when he arrives to be of lawful Age, desire is that Letice and Robert be well Educated .- Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Abner Winn the Tract of land whereon he now lives, containing one hundred and fifty Acres, more or less; Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Elemuel Winn one half of the Tract of Land whereon he now resides, the deviding line begining on Greens line on the branch, thence a strait line out to the back line towards Words; Item I give and be-Abbeville County Wills 1787-1815

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Richard Winn the other part or half of the Tract of Land whereon Elemuel new resides, also One Feather Bed and Some furniture; Item I give and bequeath unto my daughters Sarah and Elizabeth Winn the money thats in my Brother William Winn hands, a part thats owing by a Judgment thats Confessed in Abbeville Court the balance thats due to be equally divided between the aforsaid Two Girls Sarah and Elizabeth. - Lastly I appoint my Wife Letice Winn Executrix and Jn. M. and James Carter Executors of this my last Will and Testament whereof I have hereunto sent my hand and Seal this thirty first day of Cotober 1796. -
